IRN wraps up elections coverage

The Independent Radio Network (IRN) over the weekend ended its longest-running elections coverage. In the three months of non-stop broadcast, IRN provide incisive coverage of the local council elections through a network of 21 private radio stations all across the country.

The radio first became a household name during its coverage of last year's presidential and parliamentary elections when it announced provisional results that filled the vacuum before the National Electoral Commission started releasing official ones.

Speaking to Awoko, the IRN Coordinator, Ransford Wright who is the head of the Believers' Broadcasting Network (BBN Radio), said despite the fact that IRN] had wrapped up on coverage of the elections they would continue with other programmes such as "Parliament Bol At". The programme he went on would be pre-recorded and would deal with issues around governance and the Parliament.

There will also be a weekly news programme on national issues.
